The library will be holding a series of **FREE**, hour long technology workshops through March, April and May. Topics may include Android Basics, Internet Basics, Cybersecurity Basic, Windows 11 Basics, Email Basics, and/or MacOS Basics.

Our first class will be **Android Basics**, offered on March 18th at 4PM and again on March 22 at 10:30AM. This class will explore the features and functions of an Android phone. We will be focusing on phones, but we can cover Android tablets, too! Those taking the class will need to bring their personal device to the class.

This workshop is targeted at those who have an Android mobile device and want to learn more about the basic functions. It will help you get connected, identify common apps, and build confidence in using your device safely.

Our second class is **Internet Basics**, offered on March 25 at 4PM and again on March 29 at 10:30AM. We will cover search engines, the internet and how to navigate websites. We'll learn basic terminology, functionality, and navigation of internet browsers, search engines and websites. This class is targeted at anyone made uneasy by the internet - let's build confidence and competence!

Every person that registers for and attends a class will receive a **free pair of earbuds** - as well as be **entered into a drawing for one of three Lenovo Tab M9 Android tablets!** Every class you take gives you another chance to win in the drawing to be held in June.

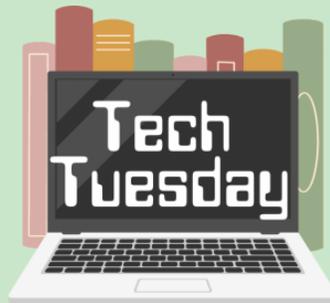
Get Your Computer Questions Answered on Tech Tuesdays!

A reminder to parents:

Our Safe Child policy specifically notes that “Responsibility for the welfare and the behavior of children using the library rests with the parent/guardian or an assigned chaperone. ***The Library staff does not take the place of a parent, act as a babysitter, or assume responsibility for unsupervised children.***”

While we absolutely love seeing children here, **no child under the age of 12 should be left unaccompanied at the library for longer than it takes to find and check out a book.** Parents are asked to use their judgement with older children.

The library is a shared public space that should be treated with respect by children and adults alike. Normal speaking voices are perfectly acceptable - no need to whisper! - but raised voices, yelling or screaming are not. Likewise, running is not permitted in the library. Shoes should be worn at all times. The elevator is here for the convenience of those that need it; it is not a toy.

Please note that any child behaving inappropriately or disruptively will be asked to leave until the following day; repeated infractions may result in a longer ban or loss of borrowing privileges.
